Irish News

An Taoiseach, Leo Varadkar T.D., and Tánaiste and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade Simon Coveney T.D., co-hosted the fifth plenary session of the <u>All Island Civic Dialogue on Brexit</u> in Dublin Castle.

On 22 February, the Government published <u>legislation to prepare Ireland</u> for the possibility of a disorderly Brexit. This legislation focuses on protecting Irish citizens, supporting businesses and jobs and securing ongoing access to essential services and products. The Government's focus remains on the UK ratifying the Withdrawal Agreement and this legislation is designed to mitigate against some of the worst effects of a no deal Brexit.

Tánaiste Simon Coveney visited New York and Washington DC where <u>he addressed</u> the Friends of Ireland Congressional group and <u>launched Ireland's new Strategy</u> for the US and Canada, which will see Ireland doubling our impact across the US and Canada through to 2025, while opening a new diplomatic Consulate General and Ireland House trade mission in Miami, Florida.

The Taoiseach, Tánaiste and Minister of State for the Diaspora and International Affairs Ciarán Cannon launched <u>"A Better World"</u>, Ireland's New Policy for International Development with a re-aligned focus on gender equality, climate action, good governance and combating poverty.

On behalf of the Government, Minister of Children and Youth Affairs Katherine Zappone T.D., <u>announced</u> <u>Ireland's commitment</u> to increase funding to fight AIDS, TB and Malaria through the Global Fund.

Minister of State Cannon announced the opening of the nominations process for the <u>2019 Presidential</u> <u>Distinguished Service Award</u> for the Irish Abroad. Nominations should be submitted through the Consulate before <u>Wednesday 3 April 2019</u>.
