It has been a busy period since our last newsletter in November. The Embassy continues to promote Ireland and its values across the political, cultural, business and educational fronts. To give you a flavour, we have included a selection of photographs of just some of our activities over the last three months.

It is my great pleasure to confirm that we are hosting our Saint Patrick's Day reception – the first since 2019! Please note that we are holding it a day early on 16 March at the *Hradná Reštaurácia* in the grounds of Bratislava castle.

A "save the date" will issue in the coming days with invitations following by email about a fortnight before the event. While we were delighted to host what we hope was an enjoyable community reception in May 2022 following the end of the pandemic restrictions, nothing can compare with gathering together to mark our national day. We are looking forward to seeing you there!

As well as an opportunity to get together, this year's reception will celebrate a number of very important milestones. The Good Friday Agreement, which ended decades of conflict was signed 25 years ago. Protecting the Agreement and peace on the island of Ireland has been and will remain a top priority. In parallel, we are marking the 30th anniversary of the establishment of the Slovak Republic in 1993 and with it, 30 years of diplomatic relations between our two countries. We are also celebrating the 50th anniversary of Ireland's accession to what was then the European Economic Community. Over five decades of EU membership, Ireland has been transformed into a more prosperous, open and tolerant society. We are proud to share a common European home with our Slovak friends and look forward to ever closer relations, both through our membership of the EU and bilaterally.

Working with Business


